Hi Ron,

I'm following up regarding our phone conversation on September 30. I've summarized, below, the traffic counts that the Bureau of Transportation Engineering & Operations (TE&O) collected along S. Barton St and 16th St S in both 2011 and 2016 in your civic association. Along both streets, the counts showed a decrease in traffic volumes from 2011 to 2016, but a slight increase in travel speeds. Roadways in Arlington County with average daily traffic (ADT) volumes under 1,500 vehicles per day are considered low-volume streets.
